- Woodsville Academy, one of the first incubatees of ERIC, conducted its first-ever live program on the campus of Rishihood University which was a great success.

The Library Reading Room remains open from 9.00 A.M. to 5.30 P.M. for its users.

Our Library is well known for its valuable, rare and unique collection of study and research material of Vocational Subjects throughout the country. The scholars from JNU and Jamia Millia Islamia University and other institutions visited the Library for literature search & data collection on Vocational Subjects/topics during the year. OPAC search facility also available for library collection to its users.

The teachers and students were provided with tables equipped with laptop connectivity and Wi-Fi for preparing their course contents lessons, and assignments sitting in the Library. The teachers and students were given the access to e-resources of UGC/INFLIBNET.
