



About the book discussions:-

Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club of CVS has two discussion cells, Fiction and Non-fiction Discussion Cell. We conduct discussions on fiction and non-fiction books every month. This forum allows the members to be opinionated and instills in them the ability to listen to varying viewpoints. In the last session, we had six discussions covering both Hindi and English books.

On August 25, 2022, the Book Club conducted discussions on the books Fritz and Do Kalakar, authored by Satyajit Ray and Manu Bhandari, respectively. The storyline of Fritz revolves around the special relationship a child has with his toys. Members recollected their childhoods and related their fondness for a particular toy. "Do Kalakar" is a story of two friends with different backgrounds and upbringings and their different takes on the things around them. This discussion was enriching as every member agreed that the real "Kalakar" is the person who brings his ethics into practicality.

The next discussion was conducted on September 14, 2022, on the books Ranga's Marriage by Masti Venkatesha Iyengar & Kafan by Munsi Premchand. Ranga's Marriage is a beautiful depiction of rituals and cultures in our villages and the stereotypes which exist. The members talked about the reasons behind these stereotypes and highlighted the roles of a village in imparting our cultural heritage to the younger and coming generations. Kafan by the Upanyas Samrat Premchand is a poignant reminder to society about people living in extreme poverty and for whom the necessities are distant

luxuries. The members agreed that the privileges that they take for granted are surely dreams for a large section of people in our country.

"My Frozen Turbulence in Kashmir" is written by Jagmohan, who was the governor of J&K from (1984-89), and sheds light on the events preceding the worsening situations in Kashmir. Being someone who was holding a constitutional post and officially involved in the decision-making, he mentions that things could have turned differently, had the few decisions been taken rightly. For the members of the club, we got to know some rare facts from this book.

On February 10, 2023, we had a very profound discussion on the book, Humankind: A Hopeful History, authored by Rutger Bregman. This book delves into the history of humankind and tries to show the human race achieving greater heights working as a society. The wrongs done by this human race were touched upon by the members. They also discussed some atrocities which still have a deep impact on our societies.

The last discussion of the session was on the book 'Our Bodies, Their Battlefield' by Christina Lamb on 12th April 2023. The author is a renowned Journalist who has covered wars in Afghanistan, Iraq, Libya and Syria. The very accounts of horrors committed by armies during wars on women of their enemy countries sent shivers down our spines. The object-like treatment of Yazidi women in Iraq by ISIS, Boko Haram's abductions of girls in Nigeria and the systematic oppression of girls' rights and freedoms in Taliban Afghanistan threw hard and heavy realities at our faces. This book left us all with teary eyes, praying for the betterment of the situations for the victims and secretly acknowledging the privileges we enjoy and take granted for.




