He is alumnus and Post Graduate (MDS) from Banaras Hindu University in the specialization of Prosthodontics in 1997. He immediately joined his alma mater Maulana Azad Dental College & Hospital, New Delhi as teaching faculty and served it till 2005. After a brief stint as Scientist at a DRDO research laboratory, INMAS, he joined his previous assignment as Associate Professor in 2007. He is presently the Dean and also heads the Department of Prosthodontics at the Faculty of Dentistry at Jamia Millia Islamia, a Central University at New Delhi. He has been actively involved in teaching Material Sciences as applied to Dentistry to both BDS and MDS students.



His area of interest is metallic biomaterials and has been associated with research work involving Dental Implants at Institute of Medical Sciences, BHU and Institute of Nuclear Medicine & Allied Sciences (INMAS). Title of the Event: Webinar on "Policy Development for Poverty Reduction" by Prof. Ajit Mani

Date: 15th October, 2023

No. of Participants: 75

About the Event: A workshop was conducted on the topic "Policy Development for Poverty Reduction" by ECONOX, the Economics society of College of Vocational Studies, University of Delhi with Prof. Ajit Mani. He is a versatile expert whose career spans multiple fields. His journey through various domains has shaped a wealth of knowledge and experience, making him a standout figure in diverse arenas. The workshop began with an introduction to current policy structure and how we need to respond to the existing public problems. Prof. Ajit then explained how important it is to listen to the poor while dealing with poverty. Such conversations are crucial to systematically develop policies for upliftment of the impoverished. Further, he explained how bad governance can lead to poverty and what stern measures should be taken by the government to curb poverty. We were enlightened upon the difference between absolute and relative poverty along with the Indian Poverty line as the measuring parameter. We then looked at some poverty studies by prominent researchers and also got to know about Kottarakkara Poverty Index. Session also emphasised on some factors that generally lead to poverty like Alcohol and Drugs use. Lastly, students asked many insightful questions regarding current policies on poverty and how they must be developed in order to eradicate it.

Title of the Event: Industrial Visit to Mother Dairy

Date: 24th November, 2023

No. of Participants: 65

About the Event: The Mother Dairy team guided us to their conference room where we gained an in-depth understanding of the various aspects of the dairy industry and Mother Dairy's role in it. Some of the main points covered in the briefing were: Delhi consumes a whopping 4,00,000 litres of milk per day, underscoring the importance of milk production and distribution in the region. Mother Dairy's diversification into other product categories such as fresh vegetables (Safal) and ice cream shows their commitment to meet the diverse needs of consumers. Engaging discussion took place about the important ingredients of milk along with the importance of each ingredient in terms of nutrition and how Mother Dairy is committed to ensure product quality. The resource person provided a brief overview of the complex process of collecting milk from local farmers, followed by transport of milk in temperature-controlled tank trucks, strict controls on arrival and subsequent processing. Several videos were also streamed for the students, wherein the importance of token milk was explained along with other topics such as distribution channels of Mother dairy and milk filtration techniques.

Shaastraath trains its members in various formats of debating.

Title of the Event: CVS Parliamentary Debate

Date: 3rd-5th November 2023

About the Event: In its 3rd edition of the Annual Parliamentary Debating tournament of College of Vocational Studies, henceforth christened the CVS Parliamentary Debate was organized by Shaastraarth. The CVS Parliamentary Debate is among the few prestigious parliamentary debating events organised in the Delhi debating circuit by major institutions. It offers students an opportunity to engage in constructive dialogue over pertinent matters. This year's iteration contained ten rounds distributed over three days. The event began on day one with the opening address and motion announcement for the initial round, wherein debaters sparred twice over the course of the day in debates lasting over two hours each. The second day started with the third round, which was followed by the fourth and the fifth round & the announcement of teams qualifying into the quarterfinals by the student organisers including Pratik Singh, Somaksh Khanna, Suhani Gandhi, Vanshika Jain, and Anaysa Kapur. The third day started with the Pre-Quarter Finals followed by Quarter Finals, Semi Finals & Novice Finals. Moving further with alacrity, the Grand Finals was conducted between teams attending from London School Of Economics, Delhi Technological University and Shaheed Bhagat Singh College over the motion "Assuming God is the creator of all life, TH (as God) will erase humanity and restart life again." The event culminated in a Cross Team from London School Of Economics, Shaheed Bhagat Singh and Delhi Technological University securing a win by a margin of 5-2 from a 7 member panel composed of competitive student adjudicators. Pratik Singh offered the vote of thanks on behalf of the organising committee to wrap up the proceedings. E-certificates were provided to the participants afterwards.

Scholarship Committee

All teachers of the college contribute on a monthly basis towards the scholarship funds of the college. This year also applications were invited from students with a family income of less than 4 Lakhs per annum. The committee carefully processed all the applications received and approved a total of 117 scholarships. ensuring timely support for deserving candidates. The scholarship, sponsored by teachers, aims to support students in their academic pursuits.

Library

To cater to the educational needs of faculty members, students, and staff, the library is well-stocked with a collection of books from different disciplines so that faculty, students, and staff. It houses more than 60000 books related to all the disciplines in humanities, science, commerce, and different vocational courses, and subscribes to various magazines and newspapers. The library is fully computerized and uses the library

management software (LMS) KOHA. The library follows an open access system and maintains Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to provide easy access to the bookshelves. This software is remotely accessible to teachers as well as students as it helps them track and check available books in the library online. In addition, the CVS library has a rich collection of reference textbooks such as dictionaries, encyclopaedias, yearbooks, and competitive exams books. The library also provides access to a large number of e-resources through the N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET and DULS (Delhi University Library System). The faculty members and students are encouraged to take the membership of N-LIST. The reading rooms are air conditioned with the seating capacity of 100 students and the library provides Wi-Fi facility to all its users. The faculty members also have access to anti-plagiarism software *URKUND* to ensure the creditability of academic and research publications.

Garden Committee

The Garden Committee of the college rejuvenated the Herbal Garden, Compost pit, and Plant Nursery. Various seasonal and perennial flowers were planted across designated areas such as the front and rear lawns, amphitheatre, and other specified locations. Plants with medicinal value were cultivated in the Herbal garden and made accessible for college use.

The committee ensured the production of organic fertilizers through an in-house compost pit. Additionally, locally sourced fertilizers were utilized for cultivating seasonal greens without the need for chemicals or pesticides, which were made available for college staff.

Through the efforts of the garden committee, the college premises now support a diverse range of creatures including birds, butterflies, etc., contributing to the preservation of Biodiversity on campus.

In the current year, two leaf composters were procured and installed near the newest building/block.

A comprehensive tree census was conducted during the specified period, resulting in the following figures:
